Christine Grady is an American nurse and <u>bioethicist</u> who serves as the head of the Department of Bioethics at the National Institutes of Health Clinical Center.^[2]

Early life and education

Grady was born and raised in <u>Livingston</u>, New Jersey. [3] Her father, John H. Grady Jr., was a <u>Yale University</u> graduate and <u>United States Navy</u> veteran who served as the mayor of <u>Livingston</u>. Her mother, Barbara, was an assistant dean at <u>Seton</u> Hall University School of Law. [4]

Grady graduated from <u>Livingston High School</u>, after which she earned a BS in nursing and biology from <u>Georgetown University</u> in 1974, a <u>Master of Science in Nursing from Boston College in 1978, and a PhD in philosophy from <u>Georgetown University</u> in 1993. [3]</u>

Career

Grady has worked in nursing, clinical research, and clinical care, with a specialization in HIV. [2] She was a Commissioner on the Presidential Commission for the Study of Bioethical Issues from 2010 and 2017. [2]

Grady is a member of the National Academy of Medicine, a senior fellow at the Kennedy Institute of Ethics, and a fellow of The Hastings Center and American Academy of Nursing. [2] She received the National Institutes of Health CEO Award in 2017 and the Director's Award from the same organization in 2015 and 2017.
